

GET YOUR \$ WORTH OUT OF CLASSES

Classes are fun, but they cost money. There are some simple things you can do to make sure you get your money's worth out of the class.

Come prepared!

- Ask for the Supply List for the class and read it.
- Have your fabric pressed and ready to cut.
- If there are pre-cutting instructions, have all your pieces pre-cut and marked.

Know your machine!

- Know how to thread it
- Know how to change the bobbin
- Pre-wind several bobbins with neutral thread.
- Have extra needles.
- Know where your ¼" seam guide is for your machine.

Remember to pack the

- Foot pedal
- Power supply cord
- Instruction manual for your machine

Know and use cell phone etiquette. Turn your cell phone off or to vibrate. It's just common sense not to interrupt a class with a phone conversation. If you receive a call, excuse yourself from the classroom to answer. And this goes for the instructor, too!

Be sensitive to the fact that others may be allergic to perfumes and refrain from wearing heavy scents or lotions.

Limit your drinks that you bring to class to water only – you wouldn't want someone spilling coffee or soda on your quilt pieces.
